Barton **My car**

Sam describes in loving detail his car and how he drives it.

Bell **The bridge is up!**

In this cumulative story, a traffic jam is created when everyone has to wait for the bridge to come down.

Blake **Mrs. Armitage "Queen of the road"**

When the car her uncle gave her loses parts all over the road, Mrs. Armitage takes it in stride, but a gang of friendly motorcyclists is impressed with the results.

Burningham **Mr. Gumpy's motor car**

Mr. Gumpy's human and animal friends squash into his old car and go for a drive -- until it starts to rain.

Christelow **Five little monkeys wash the car**

Five little monkeys wash the family car before trying to sell it, but that is only the beginning of their adventures with the old heap.

Floca **The racecar alphabet**

An exciting day at the races highlights the letters of the alphabet as a variety of automobiles burn fuel speeding through the curves of the track.

Gibbons **Mama and me and the Model-T**

When Mama gets behind the wheel of the new Model-T which her husband just drove into the yard of their Georgia mountain home, she proves that she can drive a car as well as the men of the family.

Haynes **In the driver's seat**

A driving lesson becomes a wild ride through countryside and city streets, with an unexpected conclusion.

Howland **ABCDrive! "a car trip alphabet"**

A car trip provides the opportunity to see or experience things for every letter of the alphabet, from ambulance to zoom.

Hubbell **Cars;"rushing! honking! zooming! /"**

Illustrations and rhyming text celebrate different kinds of cars and what they can do.

MacDonald Elephants on board

Elephant performers on their way to a show have a flat tire and must employ a crane, cherry picker, and other vehicles to arrive on time.

A car trip viewed from the back seat.

Mahy The rattlebang picnic

The McTavishes, their seven children, and Granny McTavish take their old rattlebang of a car on a picnic up Mt. Fogg and have an exciting adventure.

Marshall The cut-ups crack up

When Spud and Joe get behind the wheel of Principal Lamar J. Spurgle's prized sports car, things soon get out of control.

Miranda Beep! Beep!

A boy imagines that he is a range of vehicles, from jeep to earth mover to train to race car.

Mortensen Good night engines

Rhyming verses describe how a variety of vehicles, from locomotives to eighteen-wheelers to automobiles, wind down for a night of rest.

Mortensen Wake up engines

Rhyming verses describe the sights and sounds of morning traffic as cars, trucks, and airplanes rev up their engines and go!

Peet Jennifer and Josephine.

A cat and her home, an old car in a junkyard, suddenly find themselves on the road with a reckless, frenzied travelling salesman at the wheel.

Rex Truck duck

A variety of animals drive vehicles whose names rhyme with their own.

Root Rattletrap car

Various disasters threaten to stop Poppa and the children from getting to the lake in their rattletrap car, but they manage to come up with an ingenious solution to each problem.

Scarry Richard Scarry's cars and trucks and things that go

On their way to the beach for a picnic the Pig family encounters almost every kind of transportation vehicle imaginable--and imaginary.

Schwartz What James likes best

A little boy goes with his parents on an express bus to visit twins, in a taxi to visit Grandma, and in a car to see the county fair, then walks next door with his mother for a play date.

Shaw Sheep in a jeep

Records the misadventures of a group of sheep that go riding in a jeep.

Smith Grandma Rabbitty's visit

Sounds are heard from all sorts of different vehicles while waiting for Grandmother Rabbitty to arrive.

Soto My little car =;"Mi carrito"

Teresa loves to show off her shiny, new, pedal-powered lowrider car from Grandpa, but the toy soon looks old when she neglects it.

Spanyol Go bugs go!

The adventures and misadventures of the Bugs as they travel in various types of automobiles, airplanes and trains.

Steen Car wash

Jack describes the kind of car he would build--one with amazing accessories and with the capability of traveling on land, in the air, and on and under the sea.

Walters Are we there yet Daddy?

A young boy describes the trip he and his father make to Grandma's house, measuring how many miles are left at various points on the trip.

Walton Cars at play

Rhymed text and illustrations show all the things that cars do when they play.

A collection of classic Dick and Janes stories in which they play with Sally, Tim, Spot and Puff, and spy cars, boats, and other interesting objects.

Wojtowycz Can you choo choo?

Simple text and illustrations describe the sounds made by fire engines, buses, helicopters, race cars and other vehicles as they go about their work.

Wolf Truck stuck

Illustrations and simple rhyming text tell the story of a big truck that gets stuck under a bridge.
